

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A. ABOUT AIIC INSTITUTE

Vision

The vision of the Auxilium Institution Innovation Council (AIIC) is to integrate innovation and entrepreneurship into the academic curriculum to instill a culture of creativity and problem-solving and to create a culture of continuous learning and improvement to stay at the forefront of innovation practices to broaden students' perspectives and enhance their ability to tackle complex problems.

- > To organize regular guest lectures, workshops, and seminars featuring successful entrepreneurs and industry experts.
- > To promote the commercialization of research outcomes through technology transfer and start-up initiatives.
- > To establish innovation hubs, an incubation center within the institute to serve as collaborative spaces for students and faculty and to support startups with infrastructure, mentorship, and funding.
- > To offer entrepreneurship training programs, covering business planning, design thinking, prototyping, project management, marketing, and financial management.
- ➤ To integrate hands-on, practical learning experiences into technology-related courses.
- ➤ To encourage participation in coding competitions, hackathon, and technology conferences.

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The journey of AIIC established at the Institute

In June 2022, Auxilium Institution established the Innovation Council to oversee and implement a range of activities each quarter, including calendar events, celebratory activities, MIC-driven initiatives, and self-driven projects. Our active participation in these quarterly activities has been consistent and impactful.

The Council also facilitates ATL school linkage programs, refers higher education institutions to join IIC Networks, and coordinates IA participation according to the guidelines provided by the Institution's Innovation Council. We have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Periyar Maniyammai Institute of Science and Technology to receive incubation support.

During IIC 6.0, we were honored to be selected for the Impact Lecture scheme. In March, we successfully delivered two impactful lectures, which were well-received and contributed significantly to the program's objectives. This opportunity allowed us to share valuable insights and foster meaningful discussions within our community, enhancing our engagement and reinforcing our commitment to making a positive impact through education and knowledge sharing.

We were also selected for the Mentor-Mentee Scheme, where we are privileged to be mentored by SRM Institute of Science and Technology, Kattangulathur. Through this collaboration, we have actively participated in various activities organized by SRM, gaining valuable insights from their expertise and enhancing our own capabilities. This engagement has not only strengthened our relationship with SRM but also contributed to our growth and development as we strive for excellence.

Additionally, we have conducted an expert talk for referral institutes (Auxilium College of Education, Queens College, and Auxilium College of Arts and Science for Women, Chittampatti) on the introduction and functioning of the IIC.

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Our institution has also initiated the Auxi Incubation Centre, encouraging students to create products such as soap made from natural plants, cosmetic materials prepared with medicinal plants available locally, and jewelry crafted from cloth and fabrics in high demand. We are expanding our efforts by partnering with industries to further develop and establish the Auxi Incubation Centre.

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






Diversified representation in the IIC established at the institute from industry, Interdisciplinary & Departments/ Units, etc.
