CODE OF CONDUCT

And also, it supports all the departments of the college which are actively functioning by conducting seminars and activities related to their respective departments to improve the knowledge of their subject concern.

EXAMINATION COMMITTEE

• This committee comprises the principal and a team of faculty. This committee must monitor the smooth conduct of examinations and solve the grievances which occur during internal and external examinations.

RESEARCH COMMITTEE

• The research committee members must monitor the plagiarism of the thesis/dissertation submitted by research scholars/PG students and encourage the students and staff to publish their research findings in peer-reviewed national and international journals.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE ADMISSION

- At the time of admission, each student must sign an undertaking to abide by the rules and regulations of the college.
- In case of discontinuation of studies for any reason, the student should relieve from the college only after getting approval from the principal.
- Fees remittance should be cleared while they leave the college.
- The college provides a handbook to the students and also the login ID and passwords to access the College website to empower their skills.

EXAMINATION CONDONATION/PREVENTION/DETENTION

- At the end of each semester, the percentage of students' attendance is calculated.
- A candidate, who is having less than 65% of attendance, shall not be permitted for the final semester examination in the course in which the shortfall exists.
- Candidates having 65 to 75 % attendance should pay a Condonation fee as prescribed by the university before applying for the exam.

• Students with<50% attendance shall be detained from appearing for their end-semester examination.

EXAM RULES AND REGULATIONS (OR) GUIDELINES

- The students are informed about their university semester exams and other important information through the college web portal and notice boards.
- Students abided by the rules of Bharathidasan University during the days of examination.
- Students should be punctual and regular for the examination.

RESEARCH PLAGIARISMS POLICY

- All research work must be based on original ideas.
- The research thesis should have its originality and thesupervisor should check the Plagiarism before submitting it to the University.
- The Research papers/articles must be tested for plagiarism through software online tools

GENERAL

- The College is one family devoted to learning and every Auxilian should put in her best efforts to regular and concentrated study. Students should imbibe the sound traditions of a cultured life as offered by the College.
- Students should conduct themselves in such a way as not to bring discredit to the College or themselves. The good name of the College is in the hands of the staff and students whether on or off the premises.
- Students and staff should expressly avoid doing anything by word or deed that may disturb the unity and harmony of life both in the College and in the hostel.
- The College and hostel are above politics and stand for all communities. Therefore cliques and party groups will be severely dealt with, even to the point of expulsion.

- Every student should have their identity card and wear it at the College entrance and remove it only when leaving the College.
- Students should be respectful towards the staff and polite to all. On meeting the members of the staff, students should greet them respectfully. This respectful attitude should be maintained on or off the premises. Students should stand when a staff member enters the classroom or when she approaches to speak to them. They should likewise stand when the staff member leaves the classroom.
- Staff and students are not allowed to address any authority in a body. Such combined action is subversive of good order.
- Students may not address public meetings or take part in intercollegiate competitions or radio/TV/ any other program, without the express permission of the Principal.
- No matter for publication in newspapers, magazines, or journals may be submitted in the name of the College by students without the permission of the Principal.
- The student shall not possess a tape recorder, walkman, radio, cellular phone, or any such device either in the College or in the Hostel. Possession of these devices shall entail confiscation and disciplinary action.
- The student shall report to the Principal whenever she changes residence. Failure to report within three days will be regarded as a serious breach of discipline. Permission to vacate the Hostel must be obtained in advance and in writing from the Principal/Dean of Residential Students.
- Each student has a staff member directly in charge of her integral formation. Students should make use of this opportunity to get all the guidance needed. Since the students opt for English as the medium of instruction, they shall speak in English in the College and the Hostel.

- Students shall cooperate with the authorities in keeping the premises clean and tidy. While handling the property of the College, any damage caused casually or deliberately shall entail disciplinary action, recovery of cost, and a fine.
- By the very fact of joining the College, students agree to observe the rules and regulations of the College. The decision of the Principal shall be final in all matters of discipline and enforcement of rules.
- Staff and students are forbidden to organize any meeting on the College premises or collect money for any purpose or print and distribute any material without the prior permission of the Principal.
- Ragging is completely forbidden in the College and Hostel. Any student indulging in any form of ragging which affects the Physical, emotional, and moral health of any student will be severely dealt with and appropriate action will be taken according to the Anti-Ragging Law.

DRESS

Students are expected to be neatly dressed following the rules of approved etiquette, decency, and modesty avoiding dresses with a low neck, short or sleeveless blouses, hipster sarees, mini skirts, tight jeans, tight and short tops, or transparent clothing. Stringent action will be taken against those who violate these conditions. Students must wear a mask.

ATTENDANCE

- The Bharathidasan University has prescribed the following regulations regarding the number of working days and attendance:
- Each affiliated College shall work during the academic year, a minimum period of 90 days/ 450 instructional hours.

- For physical training, 20 days of each Semester.
- Attendance should not be marked for candidates if they work in college during a vacation such as Pooja, Christmas, or other holidays or when they are given study leave for purposes of preparing for the examination and such attendance should not be taken into account for purposes of a minimum number of working days or for earning attendance.
- The working hours of the college are from 08.30 a.m. to 02.40 p.m. with a break after the second period. All staff and students should be present for the prayer and assembly session at 08.30 a.m.
- A student entering the College late for the morning assembly will not be admitted to class unless she produces the Handbook with the 'late' entry. Every student should be prepared to stay on the College Campus on any day before or after the class hours as per the requirement for participation in the various co-curricular and extracurricular activities like NSS, Sports and Games, Physical Education, and other formative programs. Any exception to this will be granted only by the Principal.
- The Faith Formation classes for Christians and Value Education classes for non-Christians are held regularly.
- Attendance shall be taken at the beginning of every hour.
 A student who is not in class when attendance is taken will be marked absent.
- A student requiring leave from a class or a portion of a class must apply for it in person to the staff in charge of that class. Should she wish to leave the College, she should meet the Principal and get her consent. If she is a hosteller, she should also get the consent of the Dean of Resident Students as well.

No exemption will be granted from monthly tests and College examinations unless for reasons of grave necessity which must be proved to the satisfaction of the Principal. In case of illness, a medical certificate from a doctor recognized by the College should be produced.

.

- No student will absent herself without prior permission. Application for leave shall be made well in advance to the Principal in the form provided. When absence is due to unforeseen circumstances, an application for leave should be submitted on the first day of return. Leave will not be granted during College working hours to meet parents, relatives, and friends.
- Staff and students must be present on the first working day after any short or long vacation and on the last working day of every term. Absence at the assembly on these days without adequate reason will be viewed seriously. Those who are absent on these days will have to pay a fine.
- The certificate of attendance and progress required by the University to permit the students to appear for the University examinations will be granted only if:
- a) The Principal is satisfied with the progress and conduct of the student,
- b) The student has attended at least three-fourths of the number of working days prescribed by the College,
- c) The student has satisfactorily undergone the prescribed course in Physical Training.
- Attendance at all association meetings and College functions is binding on both staff and students

LIBRARY CARDS

I.D. The card is compulsory for entry into the Library.

RULES

- Strict silence shall be observed in the Library.
- No member shall take any printed book or notebook into the Library.
- Books must not be marked or defaced. The pages should not be earmarked. Students should examine each book before borrowing it and report to the Librarian any damage found therein. Should they fail to do so they will be held responsible for any damage detected after their use of the book.
- Periodicals placed on the magazine racks should not be mishandled. They should be replaced on the racks after use.
- Reference books and Periodicals will not be issued but are available for reference within the Library.
- Staff and students shall make good any book or Library property damaged by them. If one book of a set is damaged, the whole set shall be replaced.
- Signing in the register at the Library entrance is compulsory for staff and students.

RESIDENCE

The Auxilium Hostel is under the direct control of the College Authorities who will act as "*loco parentis*" (local parents) to all in residence. Only those students found medically fit will be admitted.

Students found guilty of insubordination, theft or insincerity will be summarily dismissed especially when a timely warning has proved ineffective. Similarly, students forming themselves into cliques dangerous to discipline and order will be expelled. Hostellers will not ordinarily leave the Hostel for weekends. They are admitted into the Hostel on the understanding that they will study hard and utilize the weekends for this purpose. But they are permitted to go home every second Saturday and terminal holidays accompanied by their parents.

No hosteller may be called to the Parlor to meet the visitors during College hours except with the express permission of the Principal.

Students living in the Hostel shall be under the disciplinary supervision of the Dean of Resident Students and her assistants, and may freely approach them for help.

FROM TAMIL NADU EDUCATIONAL RULES

"Art 90 (a) Colleges – If a college student fails to pay her fee on the day fixed for payment, a fine at the rate of 25 paise per working day shall be levied. If the fee is not paid by the end of the month, the student's name shall be struck off the rolls. If readmitted, she shall in addition to the fees and fines due from her, pay a readmission fee of rupee one."

"Absence from the College whether with leave or without leave forms no ground for exemption from this rule."

"Scholarship holders have the same obligation regarding payment of fees."

CHAPTER VII

 Graduate and undergraduate students on the roll of colleges are forbidden to take an active part in political agitation directed against the authority of the Government. Principals may further, at their discretion, forbid students to engage prominently in any public movement with which it seems undesirable that persons in Statue Papillary should be associated.

- If students attend political meetings, conduct themselves in any manner which is forbidden or unbecoming or engage in political agitation in such a way as to interfere with the corporate life and educational work of the College, the Principal of the College may suspend or expel
- them or refuse the grant of their certificate for a specified period and may also report their case to the University with a view to their being dealt with under the University regulations.
- The principal or other constituted College or Hostel authorities may frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules of a permanent or temporary character, regulating the conduct of graduate and undergraduate students outside the College or Hostel precincts so far as such rules seem necessary (a) to secure the observance of the above rules (b) to maintain the credit and reputation of the College and Hostel.
- Principals of the constituted college or hostel authorities shall have full power to inflict the following punishments: fine, loss of attendance, loss of term certificates, suspension, or expulsion.
